#### **GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS**

Marymount School Medellin is an all-girls, Catholic, bilingual school located in El Poblado, a residential area in Medellin. The school was founded in 1954 by the Religious Order of the Sacred Heart of Mary (RSHM) as part of a network of Marymount schools in Europe, the United States and Latin America. The Order transferred ownership of the school in 1984 to a legally constituted parent organization, and the non-profit "Marymount Corporation of Medellin" was then constituted as the Board of Trustees. The school remains part of the RSHM Network of Schools.

#### ACCREDITATION

Colombian Ministry of Education New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) Council of International Schools (CIS)

In 2015, Marymount School Medellin ranked third best school nationwide by the Col-Sapiens Research firm. Results were based on three things – category, according to the ICFES national leaving exams results; quality, as recognized by the Ministry of Education; and international academic accreditation and recognition. The school has been awarded the highest distinction possible - AAA. Furthermore, in 2018, the same firm ranked the school number one in Antioquia in English proficiency, and third nationwide.

#### **STUDENT BODY**

Currently there are 1000 students enrolled in the school: 287 in preschool, 284 in Elementary School, 267 in Middle School, and 162 in High School. This year's senior class has 54 students. There are two classrooms per year in grades 9-11, and three from Nursery to Grade 8. Approximately 95% of our students are Colombian with the remaining 5% from other nationalities or of dual citizenship.

#### FACULTY

All ninety-one faculty members hold university degrees in education and/or their specialty field, and 70% are in the process of obtaining or already hold a Master's degree. The average teaching experience of the faculty is 15.6 years, and the average number of teaching at Marymount School Medellin is seven. The teaching staff is mainly Colombian, and this year there are nine foreign faculty members.

#### CURRICULUM

Marymount School Medellin has four academic sections following Colombian Ministry of Education regulations, as follows: *Preschool:* Nursery, Pre-Kindergarten, and Transition\*; *Elementary:* Grades 1-4; *Middle School:* Grades 5-8; *High School:* Grades 9-11.


**IMPORTANT NOTE:** \*In Colombia, "Transition" is the equivalent of First Grade in the USA or Europe. Therefore, students in Colombia graduate in Grade 11, which is, in fact, Grade 12 in the American and European educational systems. *For transcript consideration in overseas applications grades presented will be from Grades 8 – 11 so as to cover four years of schooling.* 

The school year, divided into trimesters, runs from August to June. All courses are college preparatory where 75% is taught in English. All seniors take the ICFES SABER 11 national leaving exam and graduate with the Colombian *Bachillerato* Diploma. Furthermore, the school has adapted the University of Cambridge International Curriculum meeting international standards and providing students with the possibility of graduating with the IGCSE Diploma. In order to graduate, students must also take the IELTS as well as the DELF exams to certify proficiency in both English and French according to CEF standards. The school does not offer AP classes.

Seniors present a Graduation Project based on their intended university major. They are required to do a short internship related to their chosen field, write a research paper, and present their final work to a large audience and jury. Classes are intensified in the second semester according to their chosen field, and schedules modified to accommodate the students. Emphasis is placed on engineering, business related majors, social sciences, science, or the arts, depending on the student. It is optional to enroll in a first semester college class at one of the major universities in the city in order to obtain college credit.

#### **EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

Students are encouraged to participate in athletic, cultural and academic clubs. The most popular activities are soccer, Ultimate Frisbee, track and field, music, dance and theater, yearbook, foreign languages, Model United Nations, robotics, social service, and choir, to name a few.

### SOCIAL SERVICE

Colombian law requires that all students must complete eighty hours of community service in order to graduate. Our school values promote ethical, moral, social and cultural principles, and our students in grades 9-11 participate actively in different activities around the city not only to fulfill this requirement, but as volunteers of *"Marymount Solidario"*, the school's Solidarity Project.
